Therefore we have made our format as ritual-free as possible, so as not to favor or exclude anyone. We use principles from the AA Preamble and the AA Traditions as our guide.

This is the AA Preamble:

Alcoholics Anonymous is a fellowship of men and women who share their experience, strength and hope with each other that they may solve their common problem and help others to recover from alcoholism.

The only requirement for membership is a desire to stop drinking. There are no dues or fees for A.A. membership; we are self-supporting through our own contributions. A.A. is not allied with any sect, denomination, politics, organization or institution; does not wish to engage in any controversy; neither endorses nor opposes any causes. Our primary purpose is to stay sober and help other alcoholics to achieve sobriety.

If you go outside to smoke, please go out to the main sidewalk, as the alcove is a smoke-free area.
